

Men and non-binary are waiting approx. one year on admission, while women can expect a waiting period of one to two years.

General information for the applicant

Kvinderegensen is a dormitory for students at the University of Copenhagen. It was founded in 1932 and was then for women only. That changed in 1973, when men were also allowed to apply for admission to the dormitory, which has 58 rooms and a concierge apartment. Since then, we have strived for more gender diversity in our dormitory, which is why we have a non-binary or others list. In addition, we strive for a diversity of fields of study - partly in the entire dormitory and partly in each kitchen, which consists of 8-9 residents who also share a toilet and shower.

The dormitory has a lovely garden, living room, gym, table football, two TV rooms, library, laundry room and attic. The rooms are 14-16 m2, have a sink, wardrobe, internal telephone and Internet access

The rent is per. 1 January 2022 DKK 2,713 and the deposit is DKK 8,139.

When living at Kvinderegensen, you share a lot of practical things - but college life also means a social community. This means that you have time and space to be yourself, to study, to have visits from your girlfriend, family and your friends, but it also means that we spend time within the dorm itself. The kitchens form a setting for a cozy atmosphere and evening fun, and the residents arrange and participate in Thursday bars, the annual Christmas lunch, cultural events and so on. In addition, every semester we have a house party, which is arranged in turn by the kitchens and where the dormitory is decorated, we get good food and drink and dance in the party hall until the bright morning. We hope, of course, that you will contribute with ideas to new traditions and activities.

When you apply for admission, it is important that you fill in all the fields on our application form correctly. You must enclose documentation that you are active in your studies. This documentation can consist of a copy of your exam registration, transcript of passed exams (within the past year) or a copy of your admission letter from the University of Copenhagen, if you have started your studies this academic year and have not yet been able to register for exams. This documentation is necessary to be eligible to appear on our waiting list.

Admission follows the waiting list by seniority. As Kvinderegensen is a small dormitory with small kitchen communities run by volunteerism and commitment, it is important that future residents share the dormitory spirit and want to live at Kvinderegensen.

You must keep the college informed of any new address, e-mail and telephone number, as otherwise we will not be able to get in touch with you when you are offered a room at some point. The waiting lists are long, but we are usually able to offer a room within one to two years. In December, every year you will need to confirm by e-mail or letter that you still want

to be on the waiting list. If you do not do so, your application will be rejected and you will

have to reapply and will therefore be sent to the back of the queue.
